#### **KEY STAGE 1**

#### **Foundation stage: KEY PRINCIPLES**

Foundation Stage history is part of the national curriculum's learning objectives for developing children's understanding of the world, so they will learn through experiences that introduce the concept of **time and change.** 

Children in our Foundation Unit will begin to learn about history through understanding of the world (People and Communities).

Understanding the World involves guiding children to make sense of their physical world and their community through opportunities to explore, observe and find out about people, places, technology and the environment. Our young learners will be encouraged to talk about past and present events in their own lives and in the lives of family members. They will learn about similarities and differences between themselves and others, and among families, communities and traditions. Children will be encouraged to answer 'how' and 'why' questions about their experiences and in response to stories or events.

The children will use language of time (such as today, tomorrow, last week, in the past, in the future) when talking about events that have happened or will happen in the future. The children will develop their own narratives and explanations by connecting ideas or events.
