<u>Nursery Class</u>

This week in Nursery we have been learning about 'sequencing', putting pictures and objects in the correct order. We have sequenced numbers, Incy Wincy Spider nursery rhyme cards and the story of The Very Hungry Caterpillar.

On Monday our older children started the RWI phonics programme and we have looked at m, a, s, d and t. To help us learn and remember these sounds we have made dinosaur prints (d) and play dough snakes (s), had apples for snack (a), drew mountains as part of our mark making activities (m)and built tall towers (t).

We have continued to observe our class caterpillars. They are growing, getting bigger and longer each day. We are hoping to see some cocoons soon!
