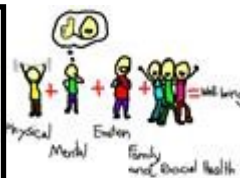

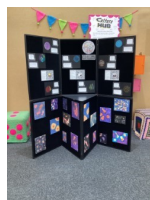
What things are made of Celebration Event



Year 3 have been involved in "The What Are Things Made Of? (WATMO)" project over the last few weeks. The WATMO project gives young people the opportunity to find out about the exciting work that scientists and engineers are doing to answer the big questions such as "What are galaxies made of?" or "What new materials can be created to help reduce the impact of plastic pollution?"

Dr Alex Hill and Dr Jaime Salcido Negrete from the University of Liverpool and Liverpool John Moores University have led in-school workshops with our pupils.

The pupils were set the WATMO Challenge of sharing what they had learnt and found most interesting about the work that scientists like Alex and Jaime are doing to explore deep space and galaxies. A display of this work took place at Huyton Library on 30th January and was attended by lots of parents and carers. Well done Year 3!
