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It has been a lovely first week back in school. The children have all been enjoying the warm weather and we have been speaking to them about staying safe in the sun/heat, e.g. taking cardigans and jumpers off, wearing sun caps, drinking plenty of water and staying in the shade. For snack this week the children have enjoyed trying coconuts, strawberries and cream and even had an ice pop to help keep them cool.

Our Nursery children have loved reading the story of 'We're Going on a Bear Hunt'. They have used the garden to retell the story and make their own bear cave.

Reception Class have been reading the story of 'Oi Frog' and had lots of fun exploring the words that rhyme. They have found it funny discovering what each animal can sit on in the story e.g. cats sit on mats, gophers sit on sofas and poodles sit on noodles etc.

It is a busy time in school and behind the scenes we are working on transition and making plans that will help the children that are moving classes. Over the next few weeks we will arrange stay and play visits with parents for the children coming into Reception. The children moving up into Year 1 will also get some visits to meet their new teacher and look at their new classroom. We will share our plans with you over the next few weeks.

Why don't you try this at home? (Magic Moment)

Magic Moments are your way of sharing something magical your child does at home. This allows the

teachers to evidence children's achievements at home as well as in school, showing that we are working together to support your child. You can use the ideas below or perhaps you have spotted them doing something different that you would like to share with us. Please use Class Dojo to share your child's Magic Moment with us.

Reception: Can you find words that rhyme? Make a rhyming string – how long can you make it? E.g. pig, wig, dig and jig.
