Why don't you try this at home? (Magic Moment)

Magic Moments are your way of sharing something magical your child does at home. This allows the teachers to evidence children's achievements at home as well as in school, showing that we are working together to support your child. You can use the ideas below or perhaps you have spotted them doing something different that you would like to share with us. Please use Class Dojo to share your child's Magic Moment with us.

Nursery: Ask your child to tell you about the story of the Gingerbread Man (they have been reading and acting this out in class).

Reception: Talk about Christmas and some of the traditions you have in your family e.g. do you always have new pyjamas for Christmas Eve or perhaps you go for a walk on Christmas morning before your Christmas lunch.

Reception children please access Reading Eggs (Fast Phonics). Five minutes a day would be the equivalent of 35 minutes of reading a week. If you have any issues accessing it please message us for help or login information.
