THIS WEEK WE ARE CONTINUING WITH THE THEME OF JACK AND THE BEANSTALK.

General Enhancements are activities which are set up in class for the children to access and complete independently. Whilst at home, your child can complete these on their own or with a parent/carer. It may just take a little of your time to set up or prepare, however all of the activities are designed to

Painting: Can you paint a story themed picture? The castle in the sky, Jack climbing the beanstalk or maybe the giant chasing Jack!
 Small world: Re-enact the story using your play figures. Who could be Jack, his Mum, the giant and the giant's wife?
 Water: Bowl of water, cups and jugs for making the giant's tea
 Funky Fingers: Picking up beans (dried haricot beans are good to use or jelly beans!) with tweezers and transferring them into pots. If no tweezers, encourage your child to use their fingers to develop their fine motor skills and pincer grip.
 Mark making: Jack and the Beanstalk mark making: print off colouring sheets or draw your own characters: Jack, mum, giant or the hen.
 Messy Play: Baked beans tray small bowls and pots and scoops
 Maths: Magic bean counting game. Number containers or pots from 1-5 and use counters, small blocks or dried beans to count the correct number into each pot.
