<p>MONDAY</p> 	<p>This week we will be learning the 'h' sound</p> <p><u>Read Write Inc. - h - YouTube</u></p> <p>Can you h-o-p? Can you make a 'happy' face? Can you gallop like a 'h-or-se'?</p>	<p>Play a game of football in the garden or play paper ball football in the house. How many goals can you score? Practise your mark making and keep a record then count the scores altogether at the end.</p> <p>e.g. Bill / / / / 4 goals Sam / / / / / 5 goals</p> <p>Who scored the most? Who won?</p>	<p>Introduce our mini theme on the Euro 2021. If you have football items around the house put them in a bag to make a 'feely bag' for your child. Items to include could be: football, shin pads, football kit, football sock, medal, trophy etc</p> <p>Ask your child to feel inside and pull out an object. Can they name it? Talk about what it is. Once all items revealed talk about the football tournament taking place, its name and the countries taking part. Use a map, globe or internet to show the different the countries.</p> 

TUESDAY

Pick 2 sounds covered so far and gather together a set of objects for each sound, e.g.

H: hat, horse, ham,
B: book, boot, bat,

Hide around the house for your child to find then sort into groups according to the initial sound.

You can repeat this game whenever you like and cover different sounds in order to practise recognising and hearing the initial sounds in words.

Share photographs of famous Italian landmarks. Encourage your child to talk about what they can see.


You could choose:


