




Nursery Class Remote Learning for the week beginning: 19/10/20

Whilst at home have a go at these activities. They relate to this week's class activities. Choose a couple to do each day.

The children could use streamers or tinsel to create some colourful firework</p>	<p>Teach the children the rhyme: "Remember, remember the fifth of November, Gunpowder, treason and plot. I see no reason why Gunpowder treason should ever be forgot!"</p>	<p>Explore 2D and 3D shapes with the children to make rocket pictures and models with them.</p> 	<p>Talk about how to keep safe on Bonfire Night. https://www.bbc.co.uk/newsround/34710746</p>	<p>Make some firework biscuits. Make black icing and spread it onto a biscuit, then add sprinkles or edible glitter.</p>

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<p>Read Elmer together. Ask questions about the story to develop understanding, e.g. who, what, where and when. Talk about your family and the things you like to do.</p> 	<p>Draw some firework shapes on paper. Can the children stick on colourful sequins along the lines.</p> 	<p>Can the children have a go at drawing some fireworks.
