



## Nursery Class Remote Learning for the week beginning: 28.9.20

Whilst at home have a go at these activities. They relate to this week's class activities. Choose a couple to do each day.

Letters and Sounds Phase 1: Listening Outdoors. Sit in your garden or open a window and listen to & talk about all of the different sounds you can hear.	Play games that involve learning the skill of 'turn taking', e.g. snap, noughts and crosses.	Thread pasta tubes onto string, wool, pipe cleaners or ribbon. (Whatever you have at home). Encourage picking up pasta using your finger and thumb. (cereal hoops are also good this type of activity).	Read a book together. Let your child hold the book and turn the pages. Encourage them to talk about what they can see in the illustrations and what might happen next in the story.	Sing the number song '5 little ducks'. Practice representing numbers on fingers. Ask 'show me 2' etc. Other songs to sing: '5 speckled frogs' & '5 little men in a flying saucer.'	Autumn time is here so look for and find out about the different signs of Autumn.  https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=aZk3SpyJKeA	Singing nursery rhymes: <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-songs-index/zhwgdwx">https://www.bbc.co.uk/teach/school-radio/nursery-rhymes-songs-index/zhwgdwx</a>  Make a sound shaker to accompany your singing. Use an empty bottle and half fill with dry rice/pasta.

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Collect some 'noisy' objects, e.g. keys, packet of crisps etc. Hide them in a box or bag and 'play' one at a time. Can you guess what object is making the noise? You have to listen very carefully!	Draw a picture of your family. Talk about what you like to do together? Make a list of things you can do together at this time, e.g. make a den, bake a cake, play a game etc. Then tick then off as you do them!	Can you move like a cheetah? Have fun practicing different animal movements:  <a href="https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CT86DI442jA">https://www.youtube.com/watch?v=CT86DI442jA</a>	Play 'sounds in stories'. Read a book together making different sounds/noises to show what is happening. For example you might make loud stomping sounds for a giant, twinkling sounds for a fairy.	Sing number songs, e.g. '5 little ducks went swimming one day'. Practise representing numbers on fingers. Ask 'show me 2' etc.  <a href="https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/b03g64rd">https://www.bbc.co.uk/programmes/b03g64rd</a>	Make an ice block. Fill a bowl with water and some small toys then put in the freezer overnight. Once frozen explore how you can free the items. Talk about what has happened to the water after being in the freezer.	Draw/paint/make a self-portrait. Look in a mirror to see your features, e.g. eye and hair colour.

It is important to keep active so try to do some physical activity each day. Here are a few examples:

Make an indoor/outdoor obstacle course.

Time how long it take you to run up the stairs. Can you do it quicker each time?
