




Nursery Class Remote Learning for the week beginning: 7/12/20

It will certainly make them smile and brighten their day.</p>	<p>Cut out pictures from catalogues/magazines and make your own visual Christmas list.</p> 	<p>Using a tray of shaving foam practice your mark making in a fun and sensory way. Can you draw lines, circles? Can you draw a face? The importance of routine.
