
Draw/design your own Supertato.

(We would advise to do the creative potato printing activity first to enable your child to explore and experiment with the printing technique and colours used.)

Today enjoy some small world role play. Using your Supertato and other vegetables or soft toys/play figures, create your own story. Who could be the evil character? What will they do? Have fun creating your own story! This is another way to develop language and extend your child's vocabulary and understanding of stories.



Continuing with our pattern theme, go for a Spring walk and collect some stones, leaves or twigs. Once home see if you can make a pattern with them? E.g.

Stick, stone, stick, stone...

Big leaf, small leaf, big leaf, small leaf...

Long twig, short twig, long twig, short twig...

Whilst out don't forget to look for the signs of Spring!

WORLD BOOK DAY


IT'S WORLD BOOK DAY! Settle down together and enjoy reading some of your child's favourite books and stories with them.

This is a great activity to explore the differences in height and length and to learn lots of new language too: tall, taller, short, shorter, big, bigger, small, smaller etc
