Physical Education

During this term the children will be learning about dance. This will help to develop balance; coordination and they will learn to sequence movements.

Science

Seasons

We will explore the season of Autumn and how it changes our environment and weather. Children will continue their scientific enquiry on changes in a radish seed that they planted earlier this year.

Plants

The children will be taught how seeds grow into plants and what plants need to grow. They will identify and describe the basic structure of common plants including trees. Finally, the children will grow their own plants and discuss the changes.

Computing

Children will be taught how to be news reporters, exploring sources of news, logos, digital drawings and video clips.

PSHE

Safety and the changing body

Children will learn about the adults in school and outside of school that they can come to in need of help. We will discuss emergency phone calls and appropriate contact.

Art and Design

Sculpture and 3D: Paper Play

The children will be learning about 3-D structures. They will roll paper, create 3-D drawings and work as a team to create a giant spider sculpture.

Geography

Oceans and Continents

Children will name some of the World's continents and some of the main oceans. They will be able to recognise visual representations of the World (maps, globes etc..) as being 'the whole World.' Children understand geographical similarities and differences through studying the human and physical geography of different continents.

Religious Education and World Views

Forgiveness- What does it mean to belong?

Children will learn how Chinese New Year is celebrated. Children will identify why people celebrate Holi. We will also look at what makes a good friend.

French

French Children will learn the names for common animals in French.

Music

Musical Vocabulary: children will learn pulse, tempo, pitch, rhythm, texture and structure. Under the sea unit.

Reading and Phonics

Children will have daily phonics lessons looking closely at sounds and how to read and write these in words. Children will have three opportunities to read with an adult a week, two guided reads and one individual read. This will help to develop fluency.
