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English: Writing

Monday – Complete Spelling activities detailed below.

Tuesday – This week we are starting a new English topic. For our first lesson watch this [video about London](#). Today you need to write in the present tense. 'Present tense' means writing about now. We use 'there are', 'there is', 'it is' and 'you can see' when we talk about a place in the present. Write a paragraph about London. Use the information in the video to help you. You can also have a look at these [famous landmarks in London](#) to help you too.

Wednesday – Read the first few pages of our new book The great fire of London P4- P7 **These will be shared on Class dojo as a Class Story**. Today we are thinking about what London looked like in the past. Watch this [video](#) . Think about the sentences you wrote about London yesterday. Create sentences today to describe London now and London in 1666. Use the conjunction 'but' to help you make comparisons use different colours for the past and present parts of the sentence. E.g. *In 1666 buildings were made of wood*, but *now they are made of concrete, glass and other materials*. Write at least 5 sentences.

Thursday – Reading comprehension

Read the story [gifts for twins](#) aloud to your adult. You should be able to use your phonics skills to help you to read this independently. Answer the questions, your adult may read the questions for you but you should read the story yourself.

Friday – Watch the beautiful story animation [Bubbles](#) Write the story for the animation using the [prompt sheet](#) to help you. Think about how the dancer is feeling in the different parts of the story. Make sure you include; capital letters, full stops, interesting adjectives, the conjunctions and, but.

Use the [sound mat](#) , [complex speed sounds chart](#), and [capital letter](#) card to help you.



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Maths	<p>Daily: Practise your number bonds to 10 every day as a warm up using one of these songs: ten dance, Jack Hartman number bonds to 10, Making 10.</p> <p>100s Square and 0-100 number line to support work</p> <p>Monday – Watch the White Rose Maths video number bonds to 100 (tens). Complete the sheet and try the True or False question. Can you explain your reasoning? Why do you think that? Can you prove it by drawing pictures or in another way?</p> <p>Tuesday – Watch the White Rose Maths video for Add two 2 digit numbers without crossing 10 Complete the sheet and try the True or False question, can you explain why?</p> <p>Wednesday – Work through the adding 2 digit numbers base 10 power point. Complete the sheet to practise this skill. Feel free to draw your own base 10 to help, a vertical line represents 10 and a small circle or square represents 1.</p> <p>Thursday – New Resource- Maths Seeds This week, I have set assignments on Maths Seeds for you to complete. This is a new element to Reading Eggs, which is very child friendly and easy to use. Log into reading eggs as normal. Click on Maths Seeds and complete the assignment 'Trading tens'</p>   <p>Friday – Re watch the White Rose Maths adding two 2 digit numbers without crossing 10 video, complete ice cream addition activity. Challenge! Can you create your own ice cream sundaes and work out how much they would cost? Only choose 2 toppings at a time.</p>
Science	<p>Animals including humans Basic needs for survival This week we are thinking about what basic things do all living things need to survive. Read through the power point with an adult to help you. Can you design a home for a pet that includes all the basic needs? Label the things you have added to provide all of you chosen animal's needs.</p>


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History	<p>Last week In History, your task was to look at the events of the Fire of London. What happened at the start of the event? Why did the fire spread so quickly?</p> <p>Today you will be ORDERING those events (This is called sequencing). Firstly, look at this powerpoint- just to refresh your mind with the events.</p> <p>CHOICE OF ACTIVITY: IF you have a printer, you can print off the following cards. Either this sheet or this one. Cut them out and then put them in order from the beginning of the event to the end.</p> <p>Or</p> <p>If you love to write, on a long piece of paper, draw a timeline like the one on here. Write out some of the events in order (at least 6)</p> <p>Or why not follow these instructions on how to make a zigzag book and write out 6 events and draw a little picture to go alongside each one.</p>
Geography	<p>The seven continents and Five oceans of the world</p> <p>This week we are going to discover South America!</p> <p>1) Re listen to the story Meerkat Mail by Emily Gravett if you would like to. What kind of home would Sunny like?</p> <p>2) Watch the song 7 Continents. (N.B this is an American song, please ensure children know we live in Europe and not North America). Can you spot Australasia on the map from last week? Listen carefully to the part about South America</p> <p>3) The continent of the world are divided up by oceans, show children these on map. Discuss with children that the oceans are all linked together, there is no barrier dividing them up so water and animals can move freely between the oceans.</p> <p>Think about which animals might we find in the oceans?</p> <p>Watch: Oceans song</p> <p>Show children continent Asia with Lonely Planet Kids guide to Asia</p> <p>Watch this video for more interesting information! Asia for children</p> <p>TASK :Create a travel poster to convince people to visit Asia. What could they do there? What animals might they see? What countries could they visit? Be sure to make your poster colourful with information and exciting pictures.</p>
