English

The Bear under the stairs

Children will use the text to write their own narratives. Children will learn how to use commands, conjunctions and use questions in their narratives. The children will begin to read their writing to check it makes sense.

The Minpins

Children will begin by engaging in the themes of the story by talking about danger, imagining gruesome consequences if they don't follow instructions! They then go on to read and explore The Minpins and create character descriptions, retellings and eventually writing a new chapter.

Mathematics

Place Value

We will begin with our number bonds before adding in different ways

French

The children will learn how to greet people, say their name and take part in a simple question. We will revisit counting our numbers I - I0.

Physical Education

Children will learn how to lift, carry and use apparatus safely, travel in different ways and they will learn how to attack, defend and shoot.

Science

Seasans

We will explore the season of Autumn and how it changes our environment and weather. We will collect data to use to compare future seasons.

Humans

We will explore the different names for each part of the body as well as explore our 5 senses. Children will complete scientific enquiries to test the information they have learnt.

Computing

Pupils will learn about the different ways of being online and learn how to stay safe.

Music

Children will learn how to follow beats and rhythm with claps.

Art and Design

Children will be using a variety of different materials such as chalk, crayons and string. To be able to colour neatly using different media and develop their observational skills.

Geography

During the first term the children will develop their geographical knowledge and skills. We will explore their local area of Huyton, they will look at know places and be able to plot them on a map. Children will also be able to sort these known places into human and physical features.

Religious Education and World Views In Religious Education and World Views we will be looking at our hands. That they are able to create so many different things and help others. The children will also look closer at Christianity and Hinduism.

PSHE

Children will learn that different families are made up of different people. Consider what friends may be thinking and feeling in different situations, recognise some issues that may occur in friendships, and they may need an adult to help resolve. Explore what a gender stereotype is.

Reading and Phonics

Children will have daily phonics lessons looking closely at sounds and how to read and write these in words. Children will have opportunities to read with an adult during the week, reading in phonics and a guided read. This will help to develop fluency.
