You will need to keep your notes from today's session. You will then use your learning to help you to draw a map of Camp Half-blood.</p> <p>Tuesday: Watch today's pre-recorded session 2. You can do this in one of the following ways:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> • A sketch using images from the internet • A model using resources you have at home such as play-dough, craft materials, boxes and paper mache • Or create another Greek vase that tells the story of the Trojan war <p>Before Thursday – Before Thursday's writing session, I would like you to research one or more area of Ancient Greek history in detail. This could include: Gods and religion, battle and soldiers, sport and the Olympics etc.. Research the areas that you do not feel most confident in.
